EAA Aviation Museum Saturday, October 23, 2021

A group of seven cars met at the Kenosha Visitors center on a brisk Saturday morning to start our drive to the [EAA Aviation Museum](#) in Oshkosh, Wisconsin. While we took the interstate to get there, the ride was filled with visual displays of multi-colored trees, displaying their fall foliage. We even saw a camel at a small zoo that was along the highway.



Upon arrival at the museum, we met up with two other club members and our docent, Don. Don was a wealth of information on aviation innovation, the aircraft at the museum, and the individuals that flew them. The museum had some great displays of the

beginning of human flight, including a replica of the Wright Brothers' *Wright Flyer*. They also had a number of war planes on display. One of the replica planes was a P38 flown by Richard Bong, known as the Ace of Aces, the top flying ace during WWII. If this name sounds familiar, it is the same Richard Bong that the Richard Bong Recreation Area in Kansasville, WI, was named for. The museum also housed a replica of the fuselage of the Voyager aircraft that flew around the world in nine days without refueling. Cramped quarters is an understatement!

After our museum visit, the eight cars had a short 10 minute drive to downtown Oshkosh for a nice lunch at [Gardina's Kitchen & Bar](#). Following that, we drove to [Kelley Country Creamery](#) in Fond du Lac, Wisconsin for ice cream. The Creamery is in farm country and they make the ice cream right there on the property. The cows were jaunting to the barn to get milked when we pulled into the parking lot of the creamery to get our ice cream. You can't get much fresher than that! Overall, it was quite an enjoyable day.
