

having them join us."









Brett and Skip had been looking at cars/trucks for sale to do a small restoration project together. In the December 2018 edition of Sunspots, the publication of Sunburst Corvette Club, there was an ad on pages 38 and 39 (see below) for a 1969 Corvette. In the ad there were 6 pictures, a description, and the typical story. The owner decided to get the car ready for repaint, life got in the way, then he drove the car into a barn and that is where it sat since 1993. It appeared that the car had everything along with extra and original parts. Brett called Skip to ask him if he knew anything about this owner or the car. Brett told Skip where the ad was, and Skip said he would look at it. Skip called Brett back and said he left a message with the owner. While they were talking, Skip's call was returned, and they were going to look at the car the next day. It was a snowy, cold day and Brett was late to meet Skip to look at the car. Once Brett found the place and entered the driveway, Skip told Brett they had just purchased the car. The episode begins...









The journey began early in the morning of December 8, 2018. The car was brought to Skip's garage and they started formulating a plan for the project. Brett would handle the frame and driveline restoration and Skip would be responsible for the body and interior work.

The pictures below highlight the result of the car being in storage

for 26 years.











After some research, they found out that their project car was a matching numbers car; a 350 cu in/350 hp motor and 4 speed transmission with some minor modifications. By December 21st, the interior was gutted and on December 28th, the body and frame were separated. The project was started. The next day, December 29, 2018, the frame, motor, transmission, and differential were loaded onto a flatbed trailer, taken to a pressure washer and then brought to Brett's garage (see picture, below).

Brett, with the assistance of his brother-in-law Tony, got started on dismantling the driveline. By New Year's Eve, 2018, they had the engine off of the frame (see picture below, right).










Brett and Tony continued to take everything off of the frame. What a rusty mess! This continued to January 30, 2019.









On February 2nd, 2019 all of the parts that they were going to be reused, along with the frame, were taken out to be sandblasted and painted.


While Brett and Tony waited for the return of the frame and the other parts, they started to work on the engine. This included ordering replacement parts and having everything else checked out and repaired if needed. The engine appeared to be in very good shape for sitting in a barn that long.







They freshened up the engine, the differential, and went through the transmission. On March 9th, they received the frame back and started putting everything back together.

By March 30, the main driveline was back together. There were still all the incidentals that needed to be attached to the main driveline; brake lines, gas lines, brackets, etc., which were completed by April 20th.

On April 28, they attempted to start the engine for the first time since the rebuild. It started, but it had some issues. While the car was running, it blew out the oil filter. It sent 4 quarts of oil onto Brett's driveway. Thinking it was a defective filter, they replaced it and started the car again. Same exact thing happened again. It turned out that the brand-new oil pump bypass valve was stuck. Thanks to Glenn Blum (pictured, below) for figuring this out and repairing the oil pump. On May 10th, they started the car up again and everything ran and worked well, aside from needed carburetor adjustments.

During this time, back in Skip's garage, he was in the process of stripping the paint from the entire body.

Skip repaired the damage done to the front end of the body.



Apparently, the car had been moved a few times (not on it's wheels since the tires were flat) while it was in storage and broke several of the lower body panels. On April 18, the laborious process of sanding the body began.







The car was stripped and sanded. The body panels were skim coated and re-sanded flat.








On April 21st, the body was ready for primer.





On April 24, while the coat of primer was curing, Skip cleaned and redyed all of the interior panels including the dash, console, door panels, etc. He also refurbished all of the gauges.

After the sanding was completed, the first coat of primer was applied on May 14th.



Skip painted all of the door jams, hood and other removable parts

and panels LeMans Blue.












On June 2nd, the completed drivetrain was loaded onto a flatbed trailer and brought back to Skip's garage to be mated with the body. The body and frame were mated on June 29th.

Skip, Brett and Tony continued to work on the car and body, installing the dash and gauges, steering wheel, wiring and reupholstering the seats until the end of September. Skip primed the car with the second coat and then Brett and Tony helped sand it to prepare it for paint.










On October 17th the car was loaded onto a trailer and brought to <u>Forrest Auto Body</u> for paint. The car was at the shop until December 11, 2019. The car was then brought back to Skip's garage for the additional assembly. The rest of interior had to be put into the car, the exterior parts; bumpers, spoilers, gills, grilles, etc. In

the meantime, they were working on the convertible top frame that needed to be cleaned up, painted and the new top had to be installed. By the end of February, 2020, the car was mostly complete except for minor adjustments and small details that were needed to make this car ready to hit the road.





ends aligned and everything else checked out. The car returned from the shop on March 14, 2020 with a list of items that would need to be done to complete the car. Here we go again. The list included a new carburetor. The engine needed to be running properly to allow us to check the vacuum system and make sure that was working, aim the headlights, new windshield wiper motor, new power steering control valve and it turned out we needed a new power steering piston rod also. On April 24, 2020, the car was complete and ready for the street.







This project was engaging and time-consuming. It was actually interesting taking this car that sat in a barn for 26 years. Believe it or not, we found no rodent nests or feces of any kind and no wires or vacuum

hoses were chewed in the car. This car is now a very attractive and well running vehicle. We enjoyed working on this project together even though it ended up being a lot more than we expected, but aren't they all? Special thanks to Tony, Glenn Blum, Rocco (the mechanic who helped complete the car), Tommy T for his life-size model of the same vehicle we were working on, and to everyone else who helped us in this endeavor. The "FOR SALE" sign is on.



Safety Tip of the Month by Jerry Mulick

During this critical time of COVID-19 we want to make sure all NSCC members stay safe. We gave out some of this information last month but we want to again remind our members of the following info:

Steps to take for all of our members:

<u>Please take your temperature before any work or any activity.</u>

Wear a face mask at all times in accordance with local guidelines.

Practice social distancing in all of your everyday activities.

Many people could be exposed but could still remain asymptomatic. This means they could expose other individuals to the virus without knowing.

A potential exposure means being a household contact or having close contact within 6 feet of an individual with confirmed or suspected COVID-19. The time frame for having contact with an individual includes the period of time of 48 hours before the individual became symptomatic.

If you feel sick stay at home and consult a medical professional.

Symptoms of Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19)

Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People with these symptoms or combinations may have COVID-19:

- * Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

or at least two of these symptoms

- * Fever * Headache
- * Chills * Sore throat
- * Repeated shaking with chills * New loss of taste or smell

* Muscle pain

If you have any of these warning signs get medical attention immediately:

- * Trouble breathing
- * New confusion or inability to arouse
- Bluish lips or face

This list is not all inclusive. We want all of our members to be safe and healthy
