Safety Tip of the Month by Ken Such

Using Plastic Bags Safely

We all are spending a lot of time at home these days—cooking or carry-out with leftovers. The use of zip-top bags is very popular. Some people like me like to reuse them for economic and environmental reasons. If you like to reuse them, here are some safety tips:

According to a Ziploc representative, the storage, freezer, snack, and sandwich bags are re-useable by hand washing and thoroughly drying before reuse. But remember if the bags were used to store raw meat, fish, or eggs or allergy triggering foods, they should not be used for any other food items. Bags used for microwave cooking, such as steam bags, should not be reused to avoid cross-contamination.

The number of times a bag can be reused will depend on its condition, if the bag no longer zips or if the plastic becomes thin or torn then it is time to toss.

A good way to get information on how to reuse the ones you use is to visit the Manufacturer's website.

A MESSAGE FOR OUR CLUB REGARDING COVID-19

The IDPH (Illinois Department of Public Health) guidelines for Illinois

At the present time we are in Phase 4 of the COVID-19 guidelines.

Here is what this means for us as a club and what we can and can't do at this time.

- * At the present time, our membership meetings are only being held on the virtual application ZOOM. We are doing this for the September Membership Meeting. Membership meetings may be held with 50 people or less. Wearing face masks and social distancing will be required at our meetings.
- * Meeting at restaurants is allowed only if it follows the State of Illinois <u>Phase 4</u> guidelines for restaurants and bars. Indoor dining may only accommodate groups of 10 or less.
- * We may drive our Corvettes or vehicles to a drive-in restaurant or outdoor theater. We may also drive to attend birthdays, graduations, anniversaries, church, or any other event where we don't have to get out of our vehicle. We intend to plan several of these activities for our club.
- * Phase 4 requires that we have 50 or fewer people at our events. We must wear face coverings and maintain social distancing at all times.
- * Outdoor activities are allowed. That means we can hold an outdoor activity if we follow the Phase 4 guidelines.
- * Phase 5 will begin when there is a vaccine, or a widely available and highly effective treatment, or with the elimination of any new cases over a sustained period. We will be allowed to have our normal membership meetings.
- * In the meantime we will notify all club members if local health officials change our guidelines for Illinois. For now maintain social distancing and wear a face covering when you are near other people.




