


Safety Tip of the Month by Ken Such

Fall and Early Winter Tips

Longer nights - Maintain a speed that allows you to stop for an obstacle at the far reaches of your headlights. There have been tests even on modern vehicles that have a short range on their headlights-know your vehicles limit.

Foggy conditions - It's that time of the year where air begins to cool over warmer land and waterways making the chances of fog increase. Drive with low-beams and use your fog lights if your vehicle is equipped with them-never high beams. Reduce your speed in order to increase your reaction time.

Mating season - Deer that is. Be especially alert at dawn and dusk when deer are most active, they can pop out of the woods unexpectantly. If you can't avoid hitting a deer, do not swerve, but brake firmly and stay in your lane.

School buses - There may not be as many buses out now but be alert and slow down near bus stops.

Fire hazards - In many rural areas leaf burning is allowed-be cautious of heavy smoke blowing across the roadway for low visibility. Parking on a pile of leaves may start a fire from the heat of your catalytic converter.

A MESSAGE FOR OUR CLUB REGARDING COVID-19

The IDPH (Illinois Department of Public Health) guidelines for Illinois

At the present time we are in Phase 4 and a Tier 3 Resurgence Mitigation Plan Here is what this means for us as a club and what we can and can't do at this time.

- * In-person membership meetings may not be held at this time. We are holding our membership meetings each month virtually on Zoom. We will be doing this for the December 16th Membership Meeting.
- * Following the State of Illinois <u>Tier 3 Resurgence Mitigation Plan</u>, meeting indoors at restaurants and bars is not allowed at this time. Indoor service is not being provided.
- * We may drive our Corvettes or vehicles to a drive-in restaurant or outdoor theater. We may also drive to attend birthdays, graduations, anniversaries, church, or any other event where we don't have to get out of our vehicle. We intend to plan several of these activities for our club if possible.
- * The Tier 3 Mitigation Plan requires that we have 10 or fewer people at our outdoor events. We must wear face coverings and maintain social distancing at all times.
- * Outdoor activities are allowed. That means we can hold an outdoor activity if we follow the Phase 4 and Tier 3 guidelines.
- * Phase 5 will begin when there is a vaccine, or a widely available and highly effective treatment, or with the elimination of any new cases over a sustained period. We will be allowed to have our normal membership meetings.
- * Visit our <u>website</u> for the latest information on the current guidelines for Illinois. Maintain social distancing and wear a face covering whenever you are near other people.

INFORMATION FROM THE NCM



2020 Official Production Statistics from the NCM



Production of the model year 2020 Corvette is expected to conclude production on December 7th as the final orders are completed. Chevrolet official count for the model year will be 20,368 Corvettes. That does include those pre-production units that were built before customer orders began in February 2020.

The breakdown of the 2020 models was 82.4% Coupe (16,787) and 17.6% Convertible (3,581) and the Z51 Performance Package accounted 76% (15476) of all Corvettes produced.

The 3LT package was the most popular which is always the case during the initial new model rollout. A total of 46.8% of buyers went with the 3LT across both models with 39.1% choosing the 2LT and only 14.4% selecting the base 1LT trim package.

The exterior colors ranked by popularity are:

- 1. Torch Red-5,137 (25%)
- 2. Artic White—3,098 (15%)
- 3. Black -2,383 (11.7%)
- 4. Sebring Orange -1,377 (6.8%)
- 5. Elkart lake Blue -1,369 (6.7%)
- 6. Rapid Blue -1,243 (6%)
- 7. Ceramic Matrix Grey -1,216 (5.9%)
- 8. Blade Silver -1,130 (5.55%)
- 9. Shadow Grey—1,111 (5.45%)
- 10. Long Beach Red-1,068 (5.25%)
- 11. Accelerate Yellow—688 (3.38%)
- 12. Zeus Bronze-548 (2.69%)

Winterizing Your Corvette

If you haven't done so already, it's that time of year to put your Pride and Joy into hibernation. Putting your Corvette in the garage for a while does have some benefits: you can clean it well and check out the condition of the drivetrain. Leaving your Corvette in an unheated garage for months at a time without starting isn't terrible, but leaving your Corvette for a year or more is when really bad things begin to happen.

The worst scenario for your Corvette is when one cold front after another pummels your garage with temperature fluctuations creating extreme condensation in internal driveline components. Engines, transmissions, and differentials corrode from the top down while the condensation drips into the lubricant. Fuel tanks have condensation dripping from the roof of the tank, corroding the steel fuel sending unit or the tank itself in 1953-1973 Corvettes.

The length of time that your Corvette sits is what really matters. Three months requires very little winterizing. Filling the fuel tank and keeping the battery charged is the extent of preparation. Planning on longer term storage? Use these guidelines:

PAINT: If your Corvette is going to sit for four or more months without activity, the car should be washed to safeguard against any environmental fallout like tree sap, dead bugs etc. Some of the fallout may be acidic and damage the paint or clearcoat permanently.

TIRES & WHEELS: Scrub the tires to remove any built up oxidation and apply a tire dressing once they are dried. Clean your wheels in a similar fashion to paint as brake dust, when left on wheels for extended periods, can permanently damage the wheel surface. Remember to use a clearcoat specific cleaner if your wheels are clearcoated. While on the subject of tires, don't worry about flat spotting unless you have bias plies. There has been significant strides in tire composition and technology, and any flat spotting that does occur on radials will be eliminated with a nice 30 minute drive in the springtime. It is OK to keep your tires inflated to the correct pressure, and overinflating is preferred by some to reduce the tire's pliability. Just be sure to correct the pressure in the spring.

INTERIOR: To prevent moisture buildup and possible mold formation, <u>use a desiccant like Sta-Dri</u> in the footwells and rear cargo areas. If desired, use silicone spray on weatherstripping to keep it from bonding with other surfaces over the winter.

FUEL TANK: The fuel tank should be filled to the top with winter fuel (available after October 1) and fuel stabilizer should be added.

Winterizing Your Corvette

BATTERY: The battery should be kept charged with a battery tender throughout the entire time your Corvette is stored whether it's winter or summer. Simply connect the tender to your battery and it will maintain the battery charge without any damage or concerns about overcharging or overheating your battery.

FLUIDS: Make sure to top off all fluids including coolant, brake fluid, clutch and transmission, oil and fuel. Always change your oil and filter before placing a car in long-term storage as well.

RODENTS: Any part of a city, suburb or rural area is open to rodent problems, and they can wreak havoc on a Corvette, particularly the plug wires. Certain brands of plug wires (including GM) consist of a vegetable based outer shell which is very appetizing to varmints. To keep them looking elsewhere for their next meal, place mothballs in the engine area. Just don't forget to remove them before starting the car. Regarding tail pipes, place face cloths over each and wrap rubber bands around them.

CAR COVERS: Indoors or outdoors, cover a car when it will be stored for more than a few months. The type of cover you select should be based on where the car will be stored. A weatherproof cover is a solid choice for indoors or outdoors, but a cotton cover will suffice for indoor-only storage.

STARTING THE CAR IN WINTER: Start your Corvette once a month throughout the winter if possible. This will help circulate the oil rather than letting it sit in the oil pan all winter, exposing cylinder walls and moving parts to possible corrosion.

Pirelli GT4 America Sprint Pro Champion Michael Cooper







A fter claiming eleven wins out of sixteen races, Blackdog Speedshop and McLaren factory driver Michael Cooper won his fourth title in SRO America competition with the 2020 GT4 America Sprint championship jewel in his crown. To say Cooper was dominant is an understatement. A string of six straight wins in the middle of the season catapulted him to the top of the standings with the New York native never looking back, besting the likes of Pros Drew Staveley, Spencer Pumpelly and Jarrett Andretti.

Cooper's season can best be described by his performance at Sonoma Raceway, where he took his #10 McLaren 570S GT4 to the top step of the podium in each of the three races. "I like a lot of racetracks, but I just seem to be a step ahead at Sonoma. That's not to discredit anyone else but the results are there. To be honest, the move at the start of Race One on Friday really changed the complexion of our weekend. The Porsche was quicker than us in qualifying, and with how hard it is to pass here we could be talking about three straight second-place finishes. So that move Friday was really critical."

"Winning three straight here and now five in a row since VIR is a great accomplishment. It's down to the work from everyone at Blackdog Speed Shop and McLaren. We had a goal heading into this weekend of maximizing our points haul. I don't think we could have ever expected this, though! I'm grateful for the effort and happy with another great weekend at Sonoma."

Quotes like this became common as Cooper and the Blackdog Speedshop team were on point throughout the season, proven by winning the championship by a whopping 78 points over rival Staveley. "We came into the weekend and maximized the points and scored three wins," said Cooper after winning the title at COTA with two rounds left in the season. "This Blackdog Speedshop team just operates at such a high level. I think for the team this is their fifth series driver's championship and third manufacturer's championship."

Cooper summarized, "The McLaren 570S GT4 has been a great performance car for a number of years and I'm glad we could deliver championship honors with it here in North America. I can't say thanks enough to Tony Gaples, Ray Sorenson and Blackdog Speed Shop for one of the best seasons of my career."
