


Thanks for the memories.

**Winter Driving Tips** 

Black ice matters when snow and ice melts during the day and freezes again. Start off slow and always test the pavement by slowly applying the brakes to get a feel of the surface condition. Icy conditions generally occur on bridges first. Another possible location for ice is when the roadway has a curve were the pavement is higher on the right side, were water tends to melt across during the day.

Wipers - Ice and windshield solvents can play havoc on wiper blades and the heat during the summer months. Check the wear both front and back.

Windshield washer solution needs to be replaced with winter solution, -25 degrees or better. Be sure to clean off all the windows and outside mirrors. Make sure to remove the snow off the roof — one quick stop and a snowy roof will slide across the windshield and blind your vision. Here is a quick way to remove ice off the windows-use a spray bottle with 2 parts rubbing alcohol (70% isopropyl alcohol) and one part water. Let it set for one minute and then scrap off. One problem with this method is that the solution must be at room temperature to work properly.

Radiator – good time to check the anti- freeze level, -34 degrees or better. Also Make a note when the last time the radiator was flushed.

Lights—Check all headlights and turn signal lights. Salt spray will dim the maximum sight distance, clean often. Good time to check is at the gas station while filling the tank.

Car Washing - nobody likes a salt covered car but be cautious of doors freezing. Open all doors and rear hatch or trunk to dry off rubber seals. There are several Silicone products out there to help you from ripping the rubber seals off the frame.

Tires – Check tire tread and proper air pressure. As temperature drops so does air pressure.

#### A MESSAGE FOR OUR CLUB REGARDING COVID-19

#### The IDPH (Illinois Department of Public Health) guidelines for Illinois

At the present time we are in Phase 4 and a Tier 3 Resurgence Mitigation Plan Here is what this means for us as a club and what we can and can't do at this time.

- \* In-person membership meetings may not be held at this time. We are holding our membership meetings each month virtually on Zoom. *We will be doing this for the January 20th Membership Meeting*.
- \* Following the State of Illinois <u>Tier 3 Resurgence Mitigation Plan</u>, meeting indoors at restaurants and bars is not allowed at this time. Indoor service is not being provided. We expect that this may be changing soon since the vaccine is now out.
- \* We may drive our Corvettes or vehicles to a drive-in restaurant or outdoor theater. We may also drive to attend birthdays, graduations, anniversaries, church, or any other event where we don't have to get out of our vehicle. We intend to plan several of these activities for our club if possible.
- \* The Tier 3 Mitigation Plan requires that we have 10 or fewer people at our outdoor events. We must wear face coverings and maintain social distancing at all times.
- \* Outdoor activities are allowed. That means we can hold an outdoor activity if we follow the Phase 4 and Tier 3 guidelines.
- \* Phase 5 will begin when there is a vaccine, or a widely available and highly effective treatment, or with the elimination of any new cases over a sustained period. We will be allowed to have our normal membership meetings.
- \* Visit our <u>website</u> for the latest information on the current guidelines for Illinois. Maintain social distancing and wear a face covering whenever you are near other people.

- *Service*. It is our honor and privilege to place others before ourselves with our charity activities.





#### **National Corvette Museum Announces Leadership Change**

Dr. Sean Preston leaves NCM, Jack Matukas named interim CEO 1/12/2021.

The National Corvette Museum (NCM) Board of Directors announced today that President/CEO Dr. Sean Preston is leaving the organization where he has worked the last 19 months.

"We are grateful to Dr. Preston for the commitment and talent he brought to both the NCM and the NCM Motorsports Park" stated NCM Chairman of the Board Glenn Johnson. "Dr. Preston made a positive impact on our organization and we wish him the very best in his future endeavors and thank him for his contributions."

Johnson said that former NCM Board of Directors Chairman and Bowling Green retired Real Estate executive Jack Matukas has agreed to serve as Interim CEO of the NCM during the transition. "We thank Jack for his willingness to once again serve the NCM," said Johnson. The Board will engage a search firm to conduct a national search for a new CEO.
