

### **March 2021**

With February being really brutal for all of us we are looking forward to spring. As we start to see warmer temperatures it means that we will be getting our Corvettes out soon and enjoying driving and doing activities. Since our club held a limited number of activities this year, on March 3rd the board voted that the membership renewal fee for the 2021-2022 fiscal year will be \$25.00 for members that are active on May 31, 2021.

A number of things are happening on the Corvette front. On March 1st, GM raised the price of the 2021 Corvette by \$10,000. The Corvette plant will be closed March 1st through the 5th because of supply issues with transmissions. So far 5,706 Corvettes have been produced for the 2021 model year. GM has committed to be all-electric in the future so we will see what the future holds.

Below are some abbreviated details from Motor Trend about the 2022 Corvette ZO6 and other future C8 variants.

**The 2022 Corvette ZO6** will have a naturally aspirated 5.5 liter flat plane crank V-8 just like the 1-2 finishing C8.Rs at the Daytona 24. But instead of only 500 hp the street car will produce between 615 and 625 hp. The ZO6 will also sport (optional) carbon fiber wheels.

**The 2023 Corvette ZR1** will mutate the ZO6 into the ZR1 by plumbing two turbochargers into the aforementioned 5.5 –liter flat –plane V-8. Horsepower will be in the 825 to 850 range.

**The 2023 Corvette PHEV** (possibly called the E-Ray) will be a Corvette C8 hybrid. It is expected to be an AWD plug-in hybrid (PHEV) with two motors on the front axle and possibly a third motor pancaked between the dual-clutch transmission and the engine.

**The 2025 Corvette Zora** will be a 1000+ horsepower hypercar. The Zora will use the twin-turbo V-8 from the ZR1 and the hybrid system from the hybrid-E-Ray. If you figure on 850 hp from the gas engine and 150 hp from the EV components, it gets you right up to 1,000 hp.

#### The Winter Melt Down

Spring is just around the corner but remember that the average snow fall in March is 5.6 inches and April about 2 inches. Due to temperature variations, black ice forms often during the late winter so be careful. Below are some more spring safety tips.

- Always take your cell phone with you while working on outdoor activities.
- Clear a path away from your home and garage for water to flow away from the foundation. Also remove snow from window wells.
- Watch for icy patches on walkways. Springle cat litter or sand for traction.
- Make sure your heating ventilation system is clear to the outside. This includes chimneys and fireplaces.
- Check your homeowner's insurance for coverage for water damage to roofs and gutters.
- Check trees in close vicinity to your house and garage for damage.
- On Sunday, March 14 we set our clocks ahead an hour for Daylight Savings Time. This is a great time to check the operation and change the batteries in our smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. The batteries should be replaced twice a year.
- On your Corvette, check the registration date on the sticker in the top right corner of your license plate when you bring it out from winter storage.





#### Doug Fehan steps away after 25 years with Corvette Racing

Corvette Racing manager Doug Fehan is stepping away from his position following the team's IMSA Weather Tech Sports Car Championship season.

Fehan started with GM Racing in 1988 and worked on a number of the company's motorsports programs including the Chevrolet Beretta Trans-Am, Chevrolet Intrepid GTP and Oldsmobile's World Sports Car efforts.

He was named program manager of Corvette Racing in 1996. Fehan and the Chevrolet Motorsports team worked for two-plus years on the development of the Corvette C5-R racecar, which served to market the hugely popular C5 production car. The C5-R debuted in January 1999 at the Rolex 24 at Daytona and produced a podium finish in the GT2 class. Subsequently, Fehan worked with the team to develop and race three additional generations of racing Corvettes: the C6.R, C7.R and the midengine C8.R which made its competition debut this year.

Each racecar served as development platforms for technology transfer to Corvette production cars, culminating with the C8.R and the 2020 Corvette Stingray.

In 22 seasons, Corvette Racing has won 14 Team championships, and 13 Manufacturers and Drivers titles to go along with 113 race victories. It is also the only team to achieve 100 wins in IMSA. In 238 races the two Corvette Racing teams have finished first and second a remarkable 63 times.

"Doug's contributions to Corvette Racing go far beyond the unparalleled successes on the race track," said Jim Campbell, Chevrolet U.S. Vice President, Performance and Motorsports. "He developed strong relationships between Corvette Racing and the Corvette Engineering, Design, Powertrain and Marketing teams, and a variety of corporate sponsors along with the various series and sanctioning bodies in which Corvette Racing competed."

"Doug's passion and enthusiasm created an incredible connection with race fans around the world. Any fan who met Doug will never forget him."


Perhaps fittingly, Fehan's last race as program manager was the 2020 Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring presented by Advance Auto Parts at Sebring International Raceway. Corvette Racing has won 12 times at Sebring—more than at any other track.

Corvettes also have eight wins at Petit Le Mans and three wins at the Rolex 24 at Daytona –including an overall win in 2001 and a 1-2 class finish in 2016. On the world stage Corvette Racing has eight class wins at the 24 Hours of Le Mans. Fehan was recognized by the Automobile Club de I'Quest (ACO) with the esteemed "Spirit of Le Mans Award" in 2014 for his contributions in the iconic endurance race.

Fehan was inducted into the prestigious Corvette Museum Hall of Fame in 2020. He leaves with Corvette Racing in great shape. Chevrolet clinched the GTLM Manufactures Championship at the start of the 12 Hours of Sebring.

# **Chevrolet Names Laura Klauser as first Sports Car Racing Manager**

Chevrolet has named Laura Wontrop Klauser as its newly created Sports Car Racing Program Manager as the manufacturer continues its shift toward an engineering-based approach throughout its motorsports programs.

Klauser moves into the role which includes engineering and technical oversight of Corvette Racing on behalf of Chevrolet. Already she manages the Cadillac DPI\_V.R and Camaro GT4.R programs in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship.

The goal is to expand the level of engineering and technical direction for Corvette Racing as it sets a course for its future with the mid-engine Corvette C8.R, along with all the Chevrolet road-racing programs.

Corvette Racing has spent the last 22 years building its championship pedigree with 14 Team titles along with 13 Manufacturers and Drivers championships. Antonio Garcia and Jordon Taylor are coming off a GT Le Mans title-winning season in which they won five times and drove the C8.R to its victory at Daytona.
