


NSCC held it's first Corvette Drag Race of the year on Sunday, September 19th in Byron, Illinois.




The President's Message

While on a conference call with other engineers, someone mentioned I had a Corvette. Another engineer, Steve, proceeded to relay a Corvette story of his own.



M any members are waiting to find out about the information to be released on the new 2023 Z06 on October 26th. We still don't know where but we do know the date. As soon as we know the details we will let you know.

Production statistics for the 2020 and 2021 Corvette are as follows:

20,368 2020 Corvettes were built in 2020. Bowling Green was in a position to attempt to build about 40,000 Corvettes. A strike and the COVID virus hit the US. The assembly plant was shut down and workers were not able to work for many weeks. The coupe was the most popular and Torch Red was the most popular color.

26,216 2021 Corvettes were built in 2021. Coupes being 58% 15,112 verses Convertibles which was 42% 11,104. This was the most convertibles built since 1969. Torch Red was the most popular color selected.

At the Bowling Green Assembly Plant workers started to build the 2022 Corvette on September 8, 2021. At the present time the only constraint in production is electrical components from suppliers.

Fall Driving Tips

Deer Mating Season – As reported by NBC, the surrounding counties of Lake, Cook, Kane and Will have a high report of accidents with deer. This time of the year is mating season and the deer are on the move. Seeing one on the side of the road usually means there are more and can be crossing the road from both sides. If you can't avoid hitting a deer, do not swerve, but brake firmly and stay in your lane. Use your high beams when possible. Oh yes, seat belts are important.

Foggy Conditions – Never use high beams. Use low beams and fog lights, if equipped on your vehicle. Reduce your speed to increase your stopping distance. Frost also presents an added road hazard, especial on bridges.

Driving into the Sun – There are no flying cars yet. The sun is lower in the horizon this time of the year and it becomes more difficult to see ahead. Reduce speed with these conditions. Adjust your sun visor shade and your seated position. Keep your windshield clean and wear polarized sunglasses. An aftermarket yellow sun visor extension maybe a good solution. Turn on you headlights, which also activates your taillights, to improve your visibility to others.


Falling Leaves – Leaves can be slippery when wet, cover pavement markings and disguise potholes. Be cautious, especially when turning. Make sure you remove leaves from your windshield and around the wiper blades.

This organization needs all size diapers, wipes, and Pull-Ups.


We would like to gather diapers during the October and November Membership Meetings.

I & M Canal Mule-Pulled Boat Tour & Lunch

Saturday, September 11, 2021

On Saturday, September 11th, six cars headed to North Central Illinois to enjoy some scenery, learn some Illinois history on a boat ride, and enjoy a wonderful lunch. The group started in Buffalo Grove and drove to LaSalle, Illinois to take a short mule-pulled boat trip down the



Illinois & Michigan (I&M) Canal on a replica <u>packet boat</u>. This canal, completed in 1848, provided a link between the great lakes and the Mississippi River and helped to make Chicago the center of Midwestern trade. By cutting travel times, the I&M Canal allowed for goods and people to travel between the south to the north.



Before we stepped onto the boat, our muletender, Matt, shared some information about how mules were used for pulling canal boats during the 19th and early 20th century. He also introduced the other members of the crew, Captain Craig and Peter, the deck hand. In the past, the mules would pull fully loaded packet boats for about 15 miles before they would stop and rest, while another mule-team was hitched up to continue its journey. The mules and their

tenders were like the Uber drivers of their day, getting paid by the trip and not by the hour.

After the leisurely 45 minute boat trip, we headed to Ottawa, Illinois to the <u>Lone Buffalo – Tangled Roots Brewery</u>. Our waitress, Tanisha, remembered all 13 of our orders without writing down a single word! The food was tasty, beer was cold, and the town is quaint. Both the town and the restaurant/brewery are worth a visit!

This is the first non-camouflaged image of the 600-plus-hp Corvette Z06 which will use a 5.5-liter V-8 and be revealed on October 26.

Chevrolet shared the first official non-camouflaged image of the upcoming 2023 C8 Corvette Z06. Chevrolet will debut the new C8 Corvette Z06 on October 26th, and we've heard the new high-performance variant testing numerous times. But all of those cars have been heavily camouflaged. Now the company has shared the first image of the new Z06 free of anything hiding its differences compared to the C8 Stingray.

The new Z06 will be powered by a naturally aspirated 5.5-liter flat-plane-crank V-8 that should rev to between 8500 and 9000 rpm, make over 600 horsepower, and use an eight-speed dual-clutch automatic transmission. Our spy photographers spotted Chevy testing the car alongside a Ferrari 458 Italia, which also uses a high-revving flat -plane V-8, so it's obvious what Chevy is going for with this new Corvette variant.

This photo is a standard Z06, which will have less aggressive aerodynamic elements than the available track-focused Z07 Performance package. The Z07 Performance package should include things such as a more aggressive front splitter, larger wing, stiffer suspension, carbon ceramic brakes, and carbon-fiber wheels wrapped in Michelin Pilot Sport Cup 2 R tires.







LONG BEACH, Calif. (Sept. 25, 2021) – Corvette Racing's Tommy Milner and Nick Tandy won their second straight race in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship – a GT Le Mans (GTLM) victory in the Acura Grand Prix of Long Beach with the No. 4 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C8.R.

Milner passed No. 3 Corvette Racing teammate Jordan Taylor near the 50-minute mark, and Tandy drove a traffic-filled final stint as the Corvette Racing program won for the eighth time at the southern California street event. It's the second street circuit win of the year for the Milner/Tandy duo, which also won a non-points race in June at Detroit's Belle Isle circuit.

Tandy took a 0.75-second victory over Antonio Garcia, Taylor's teammate in the No. 3 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Corvette C8.R. The runner-up result did move Garcia and Taylor closer to their second straight GTLM Drivers Championship and a repeat Manufacturers crowd for Chevrolet.

As is typically the case at Long Beach, traffic played a huge role throughout the 100-minute sprint. Taylor began on pole position with Milner never more than two seconds behind. The ebb and flow of being passed by faster prototypes but passing slower GT Daytona (GTD) cars caused the gap between the two C8.Rs to fluctuate throughout.

The winning move came at the race's halfway point as Taylor was balked by a GTD car, which allowed Milner to find some extra momentum and get alongside his teammate just before the short backstretch. The two Corvettes ran in that order before Taylor made the No. 3 Corvette's only stop of the race with 41 minutes to go. Milner came in a lap later for the switch-over to Tandy, who rejoined the race in the lead and clear of Garcia by about two seconds.

As was the case in the first part of the race, traffic made Tandy's lead grow and shrink over the course of a lap. But neither Corvette driver put a foot wrong for the final stint.

Corvette Racing's next event is the Michelin GT Challenge at Virginia International Raceway on Oct. 8-9.

NEWS FROM THE NCM



Final production statistics from the 2021 Corvette are now available for viewing. Of the two models, the Coupe was more popular than the Convertible, being that it was 57.6% of the 26,216 total 2021s produced.

As for color lineup, Torch Red was the most popular again for 2021 with 5,171 of the cars in that hue. The complete final color lineup is as follows:

The Stingray Performance Package (Z51) was the most popular and selected for a total of 69.5% of the model year Corvettes. Front Lift was opted for on 61.1% of the cars while performance exhaust (NPP) is on 87.2%. For stripes, the carbon flash was the most popular and can be seen on 2,006 of the Corvettes. Of the total for the year, 361 were delivered to Japan, 246 to the Mideast, and 1,274 were delivered at the National Corvette Museum.
