Safety Tip of the Month

WINTER IS BACK

So Drive Carefully

The Basics: Slow down. An estimated 182,000 reported crashes in wintry conditions.

Increase your following distance. Don't crowd a snow plow or travel beside the truck. Snow plows make wide turns, stop often, and overlap lanes.

What to do in an Emergency:

If you are stopped or stalled in wintry weather stay focused on your surroundings. Stay with your car and don't overexert yourself such as pushing your car. Keep something bright in the car so you can display it in the window. If you are staying warm in the car, be mindful of carbon monoxide poisoning. Make sure the exhaust pipe is clear of any snow. If you do not have a full tank run the car sporadically.

Batteries: when the temperature drops, so does the battery power. Be sure to check your battery, charging system, belts, anti-freeze, and washer fluid before traveling.

Tires: Temperature drops so does tire inflation. Check owner's manual for proper inflation not what is on the tire. Besides checking inflations, check for any damage on the tread and sidewalls, The tread should beat least 2/32 of an inch or greater. Check your spare the same way.

Going on a short or long trip stock your vehicle. Emergency items include a snow shovel, broom, and ice scraper. Also, jumper cables, flashlight, flares, or reflective markers. You may also need protection from the cold with blankets. Cell phone charger, water and first aid kit also required.

Black ice was in last years driving tips about roadways; be aware of black ice on your driveway and places you shop for your own personal well-being.

Hi to all of our valued club members,

I would like to take this opportunity, once again, to thank you all for your comradery and generosity with the Charity events we had this last year. We participated in some really fun events that provided very important items for those who needed our support.

First, we provided school supplies to the Avon Center School teacher's supply cabinet in Round Lake so the teachers could support the needs of any child that could not get the supplies they needed.

Second, we had a diaper drive for the Keeping Families Covered organization who provides baby and adult diapers (pull ups and wipes, too) to families who might not otherwise be able to afford them.

Keeping families Covered said that this year our club made a total of 22 donations which provided \$220, 928 diapers, 78 Pull-ups, 300 adult diapers and 10 packages of wipes. We really hit this one out of the park!

Lastly, this Christmas we supported two Palatine Township families for Christmas!

We received \$916 in cash donations along with gift donations. For 7 children, we provided toys, winter coats, hats and gloves, and gift cards for the parents.

We were able to provide \$210 in Walmart gift cards to the parents of each family.

In total there were 48 gifts. After all was accounted for, there was \$4.45 left over.

At our December meeting, Shar Wayman sold home-made scarves and gave the proceeds to the Palatine Township Food Pantry. We also received another \$20 donation, so in combining the proceeds from the scarves, \$20, and the \$4.45, we were able to donate \$145 to the food pantry.

Our club did a wonderful job in providing these two families with a really great Christmas! See the pictures included here of the presents we provided!






I am very proud of our club members because all the charity activities we participated in and do are from the heart and all are self – funded by the club members without the help from the club treasury. **WAY TO GO!**


