Bring your car out of storage

Things to do when you get your car out of storage

Initial inspection- look under vehicle for leaks, oil, water or anti-freeze. Check in the vehicle for any mice or rodents.

Be sure to check exhaust pipe(s) if you plugged it during storage.

Brake inspection- sit in vehicle and slowly press pedal then press really hard. Check for leaks in the engine compartment and underside.

Engine oil -hopefully you changed the oil before storage. If not, change the oil as soon as possible to remove any containments.

Tires – pressure lost during the winter is common. Good time to check if there is any cracking.

Starting vehicle – start vehicle and look around for any leaks and listen for strange noises. Time to drive- start with a slow trip around the block and re-check for leaks and any new noises.

If everything is good – happy motoring.

From our Constitution ARTICLE 2 ELECTIONS

- A. At a Board of Directors meeting to be held not later than the March membership meeting, the Board of Directors shall select a Nominating Committee consisting of (3) members. The Nominating Committee shall obtain from the membership the names of the members nominated for each position on the Board of Directors and submit the names at the April membership meeting.
- B. The elections shall take place at the May membership meeting and shall be by ballot. The nominees receiving the most votes for the positions will be declared the winner.
- C. Any Member who holds or desires to run for an elected position who sells or disposes of their Corvette, but wants to retain their eligibility for the elected position in the club; has a 60-day grace period to replace their Corvette, or (2) the member may request a hearing from the Board of Directors to retain their eligibility for the elected position.
- D. In the event of a vacancy in any office, the Board of Directors shall appoint a member to fill the vacancy. Such appointment shall be confirmed by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board of Directors. This shall be accomplished as quickly as possible to reduce the time a position is vacant.
- E. Members wising to vote by absentee ballot may request a ballot with instructions from the club secretary. If the instructions on the ballot are not followed, the ballot will be considered null and void.
- F. There shall be three (3) ballot counters at all times, one of which shall be a member of the Board of Directors.
- G. Ballots will be made available for recount if so requested by any persons running for that specific office.
- H. For any member to be considered eligible for nomination to any elected club position, he or she must either be presented at the nominating meeting or make his or her intentions known in writing and in the hands of the club Secretary five (5) days prior to the nominating meeting. No NSCC member shall hold, be nominated or elected to an office in NSCC while holding any official position in an other car-oriented club. Any potential conflicts will be addressed by the existing board. The Board's decision will be final.
- I. Any member wishing to run for the position of President must have served a minimum of two (2) terms on the Board of Directors in an position. The two terms must have been served during the member's present and contiguous years of membership. The two terms do not have to be served contiguously during that period of time.

- *Service*. It is our honor and privilege to place others before ourselves with our charity activities.






