Tips for Fall Driving

The Fall Season means shorter days and less daylight. When driving in the dark be aware: the risk of a fatal crash is three times greater. Also, depth perception, peripheral vision can be compromised in the dark. Glare or headlights from an oncoming car temporarily blind a driver, look away. Be sure your headlights are aimed correctly. In bright roadways at dust make sure your headlights are on not your running lights- be seen. Make sure your windshield is clean and wipers are in good condition- summer heat can deteriorate them. Falling leaves can cause slippery driving conditions and disguise potholes. Maintain safe speed and increase distance from vehicle ahead of you. Watch for deer or other animals, who are more likely to run into the roadway during the fall, especially at night. Foggy conditions mean never use high beams and watch for freezing conditions on bridges.






Saturday—September 16, 2023







#### Adalyn's Story

As a kindergartener, Adalyn was having stomachaches that came and went but didn't slow her down. But then she started having episodes of severe pain. In January 2022, during one of these, her mother took her to the emergency room where doctors found a large mass above her right kidney.

"We went in thinking it was constipation, and came out finding out she had cancer," said her mom. "We did not

know anything about neuroblastoma. We'd never heard of it. That was a new word for us," said Adalyn's dad. And Adalyn's neuroblastoma was classed as high-risk and stage 4. It was a deeply scary time.
