# Safety Tip of the Month

**Spring Safety??** 

Spring is just around the corner, March 19<sup>th</sup>, but remember that the average snowfall in March is 5.6 inches, and April about 2 inches.

Inspection Time: Clear a path away from your home/garage for water to flow away from the foundation. Also remove snow from window wells. Watch for icy patches on walkways, sprinkle cat litter or sand for traction. Bring your cell phone with you while working or other outdoor activities in case of emergency or even for a neighbor in trouble.

Inspect your heating system ventilation so clear to the outside, including chimneys and fireplaces.

Good time to check your homeowner's insurance policy for coverage; for roof damage, gutter damage, or other water damage.

As the temperature changes during the day and night, this may result in black ice, especially on bridges or shaded areas on the pavement.

Soon it will be time to change those clocks again, March 10<sup>th</sup> (lose an hour). Great time to check smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors.

Batteries should be replaced twice a year. Smoke alarms should be replaced every 10 years, carbon monoxide detectors every 5 years. Check the date on the back side of the unit.

That Corvette coming out of storage – a good time to check that sticker in the top right corner of your license plate. Signing up with the Secretary of State for renewal gives you a month ahead notice to replace.

#### PRESIDENTS MESSAGE



#### HISTORY

In 1972, Jon Poulos, whose family owned, Homer's Ice Cream in Wilmette, sold ice cream to the Treat Shop in Northfield, owned by Phil Shram. Both Jon and Phil owned by Phil Shram. Both Jon and Phil owned Corvettes as well as Bob Cichowski, a regular visitor at Homer's that summer. They all became friends, but Phil was the first to suggest forming a club. Vic D'Agostino, John Hickson, Burke Oehrlein, (our first president), Bud and Carol Randall and Pat Leahy were among the original crown and formed the among the original group and formed the North Shore Corvette Club. Their first meeting place was at The Treat Shop. Subsequent meetings were held at Homer's and were very informal, usually ending with a cruise.

NSCC's first constitution was drafted in November 1974. NSCC was a member of the NCCC, National Council of Corvette Clubs, Inc. Our first formal meeting place was Mancuso Chevrolet, our sponsor, where those mancuso Chevrolet, our sponsor, where those early car shows were held. Our first autocrosses were held at various local parking lots including the Union 76, Oakton Community College, Waubonsee College, the old Nike Site in Vernon Hills and later, at Soldier Field. The first gymkhana was behind the Ground Round in Adipaton Heights the Ground Round in Arlington Heights

In the early 1980's, as the club grew, we moved to C Frank Chevrolet, Highland Park, which was our home for many years. In the 1990's we made our temporary home at Mancuso Chevrolet in Wilmette before moving to Bernard Chevrolet in Libertyville. Jim Spellman took over ownership in 2005 and it became Libertyville Chevrolet. We moved to Blackdog Speed Shop and Mancuso Lake Forest Sports Cars in 2019, where we continue to enjoy a great relationship. Today, the club boasts over 225 members.

#### NORTH SHORE CORVETTE CLUB, INC.

#### IN THE BEGINNING

I purchased my 1969 Corvette in February 1972. I lived in Skokie and had my Corvette serviced at a Citgo gas station at the corner of Main Street & Skokie Blvd owned by John Hixson a corvette owner. During the summer of 1972 John informed me that a group of Corvette owners were going to meet for a caravan in Northbrook at the TREAT Shop Ice Cream store located at Happ Rd and Willow Rd. Phil Schram was a Corvette owner, and owner of the Treat Shop.

The initial meeting and caravan was comprised of about 10 Corvettes. After introductions a caravan route was given to everyone with the caravan ending back at the Treat Shop. A short meeting followed with discussion about additional caravans and points of interest to visit. A date was set to meet again and participants were told to spread the word to Corvette owners they knew and invite them to come. There were 4 or more event caravans during the summer and early fall of 1972. Plans were made to start up again in late spring 1973.

In 1973 some of the participants felt the loosely planned events needed a more organized plan for dates and events as last minute calls to meet sometimes made it difficult to participate as they had other commitments. Discussion began about forming a Corvette Club. One main problem was where could meetings be held and we needed a sponsor. Someone recommended Mancuso Chevrolet in Skokie as Rick Mancuso was racing Corvettes. Mr. Mancuso was presented the plan of the North Shore Corvette Club and Mr. Mancuso agreed to sponsor the club..

The Norh Shore Corvette Club registered as a Non-profit Social Club with the Secretary of State of Illinois in the summer of 1973 and began writing organization by laws and organizational structure procedures for members of the club. Officers were elected along with board members.

In the beginning rallies, caravans and gymkhanas were the planned events along with monthly meetings at Mancuso Chevrolet. As months and years proceeded, a June Car Show with vendors were held. A halloween party, bowling, drag races, were added to the clubs event list and a year end Banquet.

This gives you a brief history of the beginning of the North Shore Corvette Club. 50 years is a long time to remember exact specifics of the club organization.

#### Adalyn's Story

As a kindergartener, Adalyn was having stomachaches that came and went but didn't slow her down. But then she started having episodes of severe pain. In January 2022, during one of these, her mother took her to the emergency room where doctors found a large mass above her right kidney.

"We went in thinking it was constipation, and came out finding out she had cancer," said her mom. "We did not

know anything about neuroblastoma. We'd never heard of it. That was a new word for us," said Adalyn's dad. And Adalyn's neuroblastoma was classed as high-risk and stage 4. It was a deeply scary time.

"She's doing great," said her mom. "You wouldn't think she was ever sick."
