

Are You Prepared For The Big Storm?

You need to prepare for the outside of your home and inside. Tornados in this area are few, but severe thunderstorms are more common, still producing high winds. Your lawn furniture and any loose items can become flying projectiles and should be secured. Lightning can be dangerous even when you are inside. Avoid using devices connected to electrical outlets and avoid running water. We are all aware that it is dangerous to take shelter under a tree – the leading cause of death. Being in a vehicle is safer than being outside but do not park near trees or power lines. If you have time find a sturdy building. Prepare for the storm at home if you cannot leave for a safer place. Move to the basement or at least a small interior room with no windows such as a washroom. Make a plan and list of items you may need for protection while being sheltered. Have a battery-operated radio with extra batteries. Your cell phone is a great way to keep informed on the storm. Other items include water bottles, flashlights, a first-aid kit, and even head protection such as a football or bike helmet. You should also think about a Financial First Aid Kit before that major disaster. Take time now to gather and safeguard critical documents such as a safety deposit box. This may include insurance policies (home and health), birth certificates, and social security documents. Thanks to all for reading my articles, this will be my last one.



Adalyn's Story

As a kindergartener, Adalyn was having stomachaches that came and went but didn't slow her down. But then she started having episodes of severe pain. In January 2022, during one of these, her mother took her to the emergency room where doctors found a large mass above her right kidney.

"We went in thinking it was constipation, and came out finding out she had cancer," said her mom. "We did not


